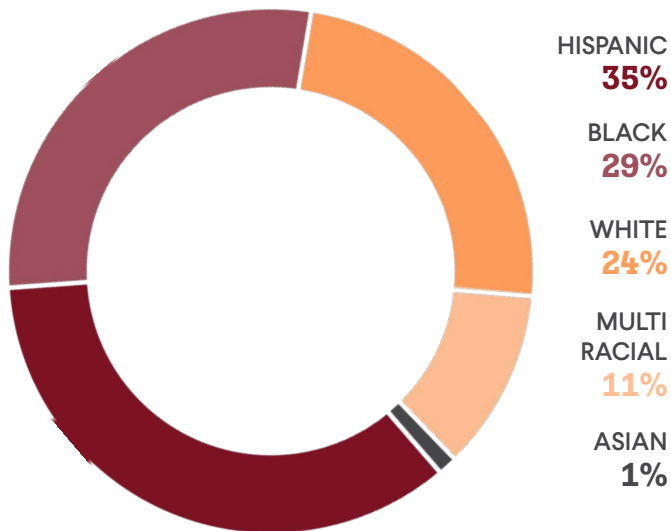

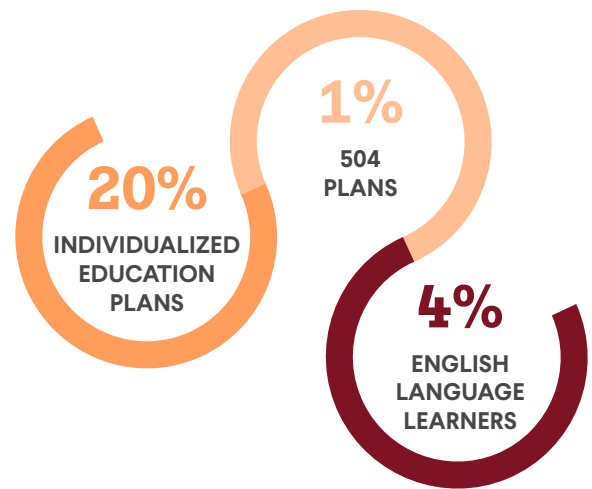

STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS



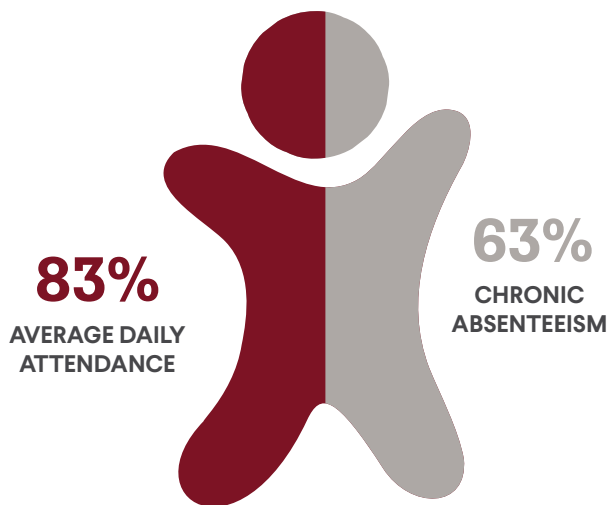

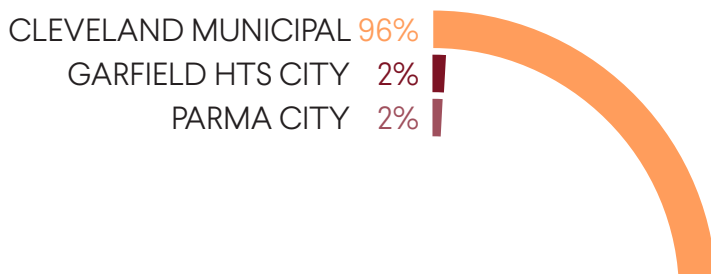

HIGHLIGHTS

- Rated 3 stars in Progress for meeting state expectations in student academic growth
- Campus Improvements: Relocated middle school to combine all grade levels onto one campus
- Special Program Implementation:
 - Hosted Science Fair where students in Grades 5-8 presented projects with leaders from ACCEL Schools, the School Board, and the State BCHF serving on the judging panel
 - Added iPads to the Robotics lab to assist students with coding and programming
 - Hosted summer school program with a new theme each week to boost student engagement. End of Year data from i-Ready was used as a baseline to create individual learning paths for students and all participants showed academic growth
- Provided 1099 instructional hours, 16% more than the Ohio requirement for charter schools
- Achieved budget surplus in Fiscal Year 2022
- Full day Kindergarten with early entrance option for students who turn five years old before Jan. 1

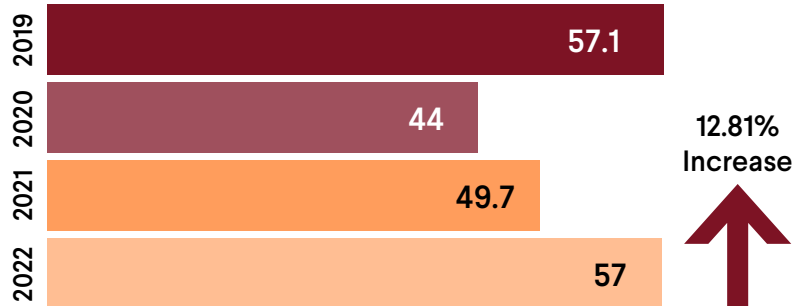

ACADEMIC PROGRESS

Lincoln Park Academy has recovered academically from the pandemic as measured by matching its pre-pandemic Performance Index (PI) score. In 2021-22, the school increased its PI by over 12%. Additionally, Lincoln Park Academy met state expectations for student academic growth (3 Stars, Progress).

Ohio Revised Code (ORC) 3314.03(D)(2) specifies that the sponsor of the school must “monitor and evaluate the academic and fiscal performance and the organization and operation of the community school on at least an annual basis.”

Buckeye Community Hope Foundation (BCHF) bases its evaluation of school performance on each of the State required indicators and performance measures listed in the charter contract. BCHF monitors the performance of the community school thru attendance at board meetings, bi-monthly visits to the school, monthly reviews of financial reports and quarterly reviews of academic progress reports along with several other reports relative to the school’s performance. Buckeye Community Hope Foundation served as the sponsor for Lincoln Park Academy during the 2021-2022 school year and found the school substantially compliant with the rules and regulations governing community schools.

All community school sponsors are required to submit a written report of the evaluation results of the school’s academic, financial, and organization performance as well as the school’s legal compliance to the Ohio Department of Education and make the report available to parents of students enrolled in the community school. As such, an Annual Report regarding the performance of this school and other schools under the sponsorship of Buckeye Community Hope Foundation will be posted on our website www.buckeyehope.org, no later than November 30, 2022.
